HHS has attempted to obtain from the American Kidney Fund information regarding the patients who receive assistance from AKF and will be affected by AKF's promised departure from California on January 1, 2020. AKF has declined to provide that information and remains the only entity that knows who the affected patients are.

Dear Ms. Burton:

I'm aware the American Kidney Fund (AKF) plans to cease providing assistance to California patients as soon as the end of this year. California law, including recently enacted Assembly Bill 290, does not require the AKF to leave California. To the extent AKF elects to leave California, I am working to find ways to protect patients from losing their coverage. One such way is for AKF to provide Covered California with contact information for the 3700+ Californians who will be impacted by the AKF's decision to leave California.

If AKF provides this information to Covered California, the State can help patients learn about affordable coverage options in an attempt to avoid unnecessarily losing coverage when AKF ends its premium assistance in California. If AKF believes that privacy laws prohibit sharing this information with Covered California, AKF could obtain the affected patients' consent to share their information for the limited purpose of learning about other available coverage sources. However, if the AKF chooses to withhold the identity of the impacted patients, the AKF will simply compound the harm caused by its unnecessary departure.

The State of California believes that preserving the patients' health is paramount, as AKF has stated publicly. Accordingly, I urge AKF to take the simple step of identifying impacted patients to Covered California.

Thank you for your letter of November 15, 2019. All of us at the American Kidney Fund share your concern for the Californians affected by Assembly Bill 290 (AB 290). AKF has helped end stage renal disease patients in California for almost 50 years, and until Governor Newsom signed AB 290, we had no intention of withdrawing our health insurance premium assistance program from the state. As we explained to lawmakers many times over the course of the 2019 legislative session, AB 290 puts AKF in an irreconcilable conflict with federal law. AB 290 creates a new set of state rules that conflict with the federal rules, and this conflict, as well as the infringement on AKF's First Amendment rights, is what is forcing AKF to withdraw our program from California. Moreover, AKF's program operates nationwide under federal rules that require AKF to apply the program uniformly to recipients in every state.

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We previously tried to work with the state. In fact, on the first day of open enrollment (October 15, 2019), two days after the bill was signed into law, we reached out to the Department of Managed Health Care to see how we might work together to ensure a smooth transition for those Californians affected by AB 290. We did not receive a response to the email we sent (see attached).

We have urged, and continue to urge, the state to develop a plan to help its residents whom AKF can no longer assist. Your letter now suggests that Covered California may be able to help, and we hope this will be the case for some patients. As we understand Covered California, it is not available to Medicare beneficiaries and undocumented persons. Subsidies are also unavailable to those who have health insurance offered by an employer. AKF helps more than 3,700 low-income and largely minority Californians; of this group, nearly 65 percent are on Medicare or an employer plan (or COBRA), and many are undocumented. As a result, many of the patients we assist will likely not be able to enroll in a Covered California plan. These patients need both a primary plan and supplemental coverage to get the health care that they need and to qualify for a transplant list. That is the reason AKF has been assisting them.

We remain in ongoing communication with our California grant recipients and are able to disseminate materials to them very quickly. Because it is not practical or prudent for us to disclose their names and provide contact information, we ask that you provide us whatever information you have about Covered California and we will make every effort to get this information into patients'
