UNOPPOSED MOTION TO STAY BRIEFING SCHEDULE

The federal defendants and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania respectfully request that this Court stay the briefing schedule pending the parties' filing of motions to govern further proceedings and the Court's disposition of those motions. The only other party to this appeal, intervenor Little Sisters of the Poor, does not oppose this motion.

1. Plaintiff-appellant, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, challenges two interim final rules issued by the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Labor, and the Department of the Treasury.

- 2. The agencies have promulgated final rules superseding those interim final rules. The final rules were made publicly available on the Federal Register's website (https://www.federalregister.gov/publicinspection/current), on November 7, 2018, and are scheduled to be published in the Federal Register on November 15, 2018.
- 3. Briefing has not yet been completed in this case. The government and intervenor the Little Sisters filed their opening briefs on September 21, 2018, and Pennsylvania's response brief is currently due November 14, 2018.
- 4. In a separate letter submitted to this Court, the government proposed that the parties file motions to govern further proceedings by November 20, 2018.
- 5. The federal defendants and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania respectfully request that the current briefing deadlines be stayed pending the Court's disposition of those motions and the issuance of a revised briefing schedule if appropriate.
- 6. Intervenor Little Sisters of the Poor has authorized us to represent that it does not oppose this motion.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, the Court should stay the current briefing deadlines pending the Court's disposition of motions to govern further proceedings and the issuance of a revised briefing schedule if appropriate.
