ORDER:

IT IS ORDERED that appellants' motion for an extension to file their petition for rehearing/petition for rehearing en banc is DENIED. Fifth Circuit Rule 40.2.4 provides that "[a]ny petition for rehearing en banc must be received in the clerk's office within the time specified in FED. R. APP. P. 40(d)(1). Counsel should not request extensions of time except for the most compelling reasons." There is nothing compelling, let alone "most compelling," about the fact that lawyers are busy. Moreover, it is extremely risky to wait until right before a deadline to request an extension.
