ORDER

On May 28, 2024, the parties filed a joint motion to stay the case until a time after the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (“CFPB”) enacted rules regarding the Fair Credit Reporting Act. (Dkt. 72). The following day, the Court granted the motion by text order, staying this case until September 27, 2024. On September 27, the parties then filed a joint status report in which they requested that the Court extend the stay for an additional 90 days. (Dkt. 74). On the same day, the Court issued an order granting the parties’ request. (Dkt. 75). The Court stayed the case until December 27, 2024, and ordered the parties to file an agreed motion to extend the stay or a joint status report on or before December 27, 2024. (*Id.*).

Now before the Court is the parties’ latest joint status report. (Dkt. 77). The parties jointly request that this Court extend the stay for another 90 days while the CFPB continues its rulemaking process. (*Id.*).

Accordingly, **IT IS ORDERED** that this case is **STAYED** until April 2, 2025. All pending deadlines are stayed pending further order of this Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall file an agreed motion to extend the stay or a joint status report on or before April 2, 2025.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that, in the event that the CFPB issues a final rule during the stay, the parties shall submit a joint status report within 30 days of enactment of the final rule.
